At the southern end of the Legacy Trail, you will find a key piece of history: The Historic Venice Train Depot.

Built in 1927, this yellow Mediterranean revival structure with simple arches and red tile roofs greeted the trains that brought many travelers to this destination including the Kentucky Military Institute cadets who came here during the 1930s. Located at 303 East Venice Avenue, the train depot was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1989 and was restored after Sarasota County purchased the depot in 1998.

Stroll along this path in paradise and enjoy its serene setting and spectacular views of the Intracoastal, while you discover the history museum inside, plus the Ringling Circus Train Car and red caboose behind the station.
