Habitat South Sarasota has completed over 170 energy-efficient residences built or rehabbed in Laurel, Nokomis, North Port, Osprey, Venice, and Englewood since 1992.

Through Habitat's successful program, prospective homeowners are selected through an extensive application process. Those who are approved actively participate, contributing time and 'sweat equity' toward their home's construction.

"Our homeowners work so hard for their forever homes," says Christina McCauley, CEO/Executive Director. "They must give 300 hours of sweat equity towards building their own home and the homes of other families and attend 8 two-and-a-half-hour homeowner classes and a HUD-certified 'First Time Homebuyer Workshop.'"



Building costs for Habitat homes are paid for, in part, through the ReStore, the non-profit's home improvement outlet and donation center. ReStore Director Tracy Wilson brings a wealth of retail expertise along with his enthusiasm to be a part of an organization that changes family lives. "Our proceeds build homes, community, and hope. The families that Habitat helps gain more than just safety, security, and a roof over their heads. They acquire a sense of belonging, pride, and self-esteem, plus improved job prospects and educational opportunities. This, in turn, creates a positive ripple effect throughout the community, in that home values increase and neighborhood connections are strengthened."

"Individuals that become homeowners through our program reduce their dependence on community, social, and financial services," Christina explains. "These are substantial benefits for those individuals and particularly positive for the next generation and generations to come."
