

Since cats can sleep up to 16 hours a day and feel vulnerable when resting, they purposefully seek out spaces that they feel are safe for their slumbers; therefore, if Mittens takes a nap in your lap, this indicates that she feels safe, secure and loved.

Want to show your love to your feline friend? Cats enjoy being showered with special attention, such as petting, talking to them, giving kitty a massage or a special treat. Setting aside some time for playing together or training can provide great opportunities for bonding.
